YO-YO DUO STRING FURY TO ENTERTAIN CROWDS AT DOWNTOWN HOLLAND STREET PERFORMER SERIES THIS THURSDAY

Holland, MI — Whitehall natives Sky Lownds and Luke Westrate, who make up the yo-yo duo String Fury, will amaze attendees at the Downtown Holland Street Performer Series this Thursday, July 24 with their yo-yoing skills. Co-sponsored by Gentex Corporation, the Downtown Holland Street Performer Series is held each Thursday night during the summer from 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm. The Series features nearly 35 talented acts each week, including magicians, break dancers, musicians, aerial acrobats, face painters, caricaturists, hula hoopers, and much more. While the Series is free to attend, tipping is highly encouraged.

String Fury came to be after Lownds first showed Westrate a few basic tricks on an old Duncan Butterfly yo-yo. Westrate's interest was peaked, and they each bought new yo-yos to practice learning new skills. After many self-trained sessions, they decided to set their act to music. Lownds and Westrate realized that they wanted to perform for the public when they saw the reaction they got from their friends while performing. Lownds introduced Westrate to the Downtown Holland Street Performer Series, and the rest is history. This is String Fury's second year in the Series.

"Our favorite part about being in the Street Performer Series is getting a reaction from the crowd," said Westrate. "When we know we have landed a good trick and we look up to a wave of applause and kids smiling, it is the best feeling in the world."
