KEVIN KAMMERAAD BRINGS COOPERFLY PUPPET TROUPE, SPECIAL GUEST ANDRES SALGUERO TO DOWNTOWN HOLLAND'S STREET PERFORMER SERIES THIS THURSDAY

Holland, MI—Kevin Kammeraad and the Cooperfly Puppet Troupe, with special musical guest Andres Salguero, will make a one-time appearance at the Downtown Holland Street Performer Series this Thursday, August 21. Co-sponsored by Gentex Corporation, the Street Performer Series is held each Thursday during the summer from 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm and features nearly 35 performing artists and groups, including face painters, musicians, aerial acrobats, magicians, caricature artists, and much more. The Series is free to attend, but tipping the performers is highly encouraged.

Kammeraad's interest in puppetry began when he met Hollander Betty Essenburg while in the midst of creating his first children's poetry book, *The Tomato Collection*. Kammeraad commissioned Essenburg to build a puppet of Jacob, a character from *The Tomato Collection*, and Kammeraad's career as a children's performer took off. Kammeraad recently formed The Cooperfly Puppet Troupe with his cousin Justin Haveman.

Kevin and the Cooperfly Puppet Troupe began street performing right here in Holland. They have been involved with ArtPrize and Tulip Time, along with a variety of other special events in West Michigan. While he mainly speaks and performs at schools, libraries, festivals and conferences, Kammeraad loves street performing for the spontaneity and the opportunity to build connections with those passing by. This week's street performance will also feature bilingual music artist Andres Salguero. Salguero's family-friendly music showcases many different Latin genres, including as mariachi, bachata and salsa.

"Our hope is to bring smiles to those passing by. They didn't know they'd be singing, dancing or playing along, but suddenly they are! That's one of the best things about street performing," Kammeraad said. "And with the size of Holland's Thursday night Street Performer Series, there's so much to stumble on! It has become a tradition for us to be part of it. For this performance, we're thrilled our friend Andres Salguero will be joining us. He brings fantastic family music to life in both English and Spanish. We're excited to be collaborating and trying out some new ideas together!"
